## Serving at the Race Track

This weekend and Monday afternoon CCA has an opportunity to raise some extra funds for the Athletic Dept. The owners of the NH Speedway open up the track for people to come in and assist with cleaning, and they in turn give money to groups who volunteer.

Originally it looked like our organization would not be able to get in on this opportunity but a group dropped out and we were placed in their spot. We will be serving on Sunday afternoon from 2:30 PM to about 8:00 PM, with a second opportunity on Monday, from 2:15 until about the same time. They need 25 people on each day.

On Sunday the Girls Varsity Soccer players will be helping as they have a game on Monday afternoon. They are meeting at the Department of Motor Vehicle on Hazen drive by 2:30 PM to catch the bus to the track.

On Monday then we will take as many kids as are able to go, transporting them in our mini buses. This is limited to students 14 and older. **Anyone under 18 must provide a waiver signed by a parent.** An original of this form was given to your student on Friday. If you did not receive that, you can fill it out at school on Monday morning for them.
