Dear *INCOMING* 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> Grade High School Parents:

We are strongly committed to seeing each student at CCA excel and reach his or her potential. Much learning goes on during the summer. The research clearly documents that reading is one of the most important foundational skills for acquiring knowledge and understanding. The continuation of reading over the summer makes a significant difference in the ability of children to transition from summer vacation to the academic fall beginning.

**All students who are enrolled in the dual credit program for American Literature or British Literature are required to read a minimum of 800 pages from the reading list and to keep a Reading Log. The log is due the first day of school and will be counted as a project grade for quarter 1.**

Students should complete their summer reading before the beginning of school. We are suggesting the reading of many of the great classics in literature that teach morals, traditional family values, and creativity.

There is a Reading Log as well as a Suggested Reading Lists on the school website under the *Forms and Policies* link. The 11<sup>th</sup> grade list gives special emphasis to American Literature where the 12<sup>th</sup> grade list focuses on British Literature.

Students who read 800+ pages will be honored during one of our morning assemblies at the start of the school year and given a delicious ice cream treat during a specified lunch time. All students who read 2,000+ pages will be honored with a special lunch at the Red Apple Buffet.

Students who have fulfilled their Independent Reading assignments for the present school year may begin their summer reading during the month of May.
