

"And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man." Luke 2:52




- We desire our students to ask deep questions in search of truth, knowing that truth is worth finding.

- We desire our students to become aware of their spiritual gifts, and the knowledge to use them accordingly.




- Twe desire our students to build a deep understanding of how to think (not just what to think).

- Twe desire our students to use knowledge with ingenuity and innovation to solve complex problems.


## PORTRAIT OF A GRADUATE

## **HISTORY**

#### 1974- CONCORD CHRISTIAN SCHOOL

Concord Christian School first opened its doors in the fall of 1974 as a ministry of First Baptist Church in Concord, NH. Housed within the FBC facility and grounds, CCS developed into a flourishing K-12 school with enrollment gains annually. In 1999, CCS was accredited by the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI). With limited space for both church and school programs to remain in the same facility, it was decided that the church facility would house grades K-8 with plans to close the high school in 2004.



#### 2006- CONCORD CHRISTIAN ACADEMY

Upon the closure of the Concord Christian High School, there was a strong desire to create an independent school for a PK-12 program. In the spring of 2006, Concord Christian School formed Concord Christian Academy as an independent school. Grades K-8 remained at the church facility for the 2006-2007 year and CCA began the one year search for a new facility. In the spring of 2007, after researching over 40 properties in the city of Concord, the board of directors of CCA walked into the halls of 37 Regional Drive. After much prayer, working with architects, coordinating with the city zoning board, and raising money from generous donors, CCA finally had its own home... a home that was so much more than one had ever hoped for or even dreamed as a possibility.

With the birth of CCA a new vision originated to expand the academic program to include the addition of a Pre-kindergarten program, dual enrollment college classes for juniors and seniors affording students the opportunity to earn 1+ years of college credit, and a joint accreditation with both New England Schools and Colleges (NEASC) as well as ACSI. As plans unfolded more amazing surprises awaited the CCA community. Within a decade, CCA was primed to add to the existing facility a new wing with five classrooms, a performing arts auditorium, a student center fondly named, "Kingsmen Hall", and a state-of-the-art gymnasium. More than doubling the original footprint of the school, the new additional 10,000+ square feet again showcased God's faithfulness in answering prayer.

Although the campus of Concord Christian has been relocated and the outreach to the greater central New Hampshire community has been expanded, core themes have remained constant and steadfast: qualified and caring faculty and staff, dependence on God to answer prayer and provide, commitment to academic excellence and conviction to the foundational principles of God's Word. CCA's theme verses throughout the beginning process of becoming independent until the present ring forth loud and clear:

"Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, accordingly to His power that is at work within us, to Him be glory in the church and in Jesus Christ throughout all generations, forever and ever!" Ephesians 3:20-21


- † Uphold excellence in CCA's classrooms producing measurable results.


- Create and implement a comprehensive Master Facility Plan that outlines priorities for future buildouts.
